Urge House and Senate to Enact Pro-Life Legislation

We have great news! This past Friday, January 19, the U.S. House of Representatives scheduled a vote on the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act. And the Senate is working to schedule a vote soon on the Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act, which passed the House last October. The House vote is timed to coincide with the annual March for Life in Washington, DC, which was on Friday, January 19. There is hope that the Senate vote will be scheduled this week or next, but that has not yet been determined.



4th grade - Winter bags (ChapStick, hand cream, hand warmers, hot cocoa packets, and gift cards i.e. Wawa or McDonalds)


5th grade – Dental kits (toothbrush, travel size toothpaste and mouthwash, floss, etc.)




