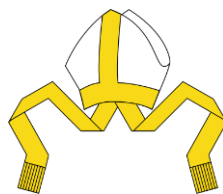

Choosing a Confirmation Name and Saint Project

One of the exciting parts of preparing for Confirmation is choosing a name. Choosing or being given a new name is a tradition in both the Hebrew and Christian Scriptures reflecting a change/conversion in lifestyle.

Candidates may choose the name of a Christian saint by which to be called; it should be the name of a saint you have read and learned about, admire, and want to imitate. This saint will provide a role model for living the Christian faith. You will call upon this saint to pray for you. You will be under the saint's patronage.

1. Research some Saints.

2. When you feel a connection to a Saint, choose their name and start your report.
3. Choose **either** a report or poster.

Directions for Report

Research the saint whose name you have chosen for your Confirmation name.
Report must be typed and printed out.

Paragraph 1: Name of saint, feast day, 3 facts about his/her early life. Was the saint a martyr?

Paragraph 2: Explain which gift of the Holy Spirit helped your saint follow Christ and which Beatitude guided this saint during his/her life.

Paragraph 3. Explain how the saint lived a life of holiness and tell what you can do to follow the saint by example.

Directions for Poster

Include the same information as above in bullet form, arranged on a poster. Include an image of the saint and a church that was named after your saint.

Your information can be handwritten on the poster or typed and attached to the poster.

*****Do not copy and paste your report. It should be in your own word**

Service Projects (Independent/Self-Paced)

Service is to be based on spiritual and corporal works of mercy and most of all, on the example of Jesus Christ who came to serve. Service to others is an integral part of our call to live out our faith and to use our gifts and talents to serve others.

To strengthen the Confirmation Candidate's lifelong commitment to service, we encourage you to live the corporal and spiritual works of mercy through your participation in at least 5 hours of service or 3 different service projects.

Wreaths Across America

Service can include but is not limited to:

- † Visit the sick and/or the elderly in a nursing home or a friend who is having a difficult time.
- † Assist an elderly neighbor with chores (for free).
- † Volunteer at the local library.
- † Volunteer with tutoring or coaching younger children.
- † Assist with clothing/food drives or bring a meal to a family with a new baby.

“For by the Sacrament of Confirmation, [the baptized] are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit. Hence they are, as true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obligated to spread and defend the faith by word and deed.” (CCC 1285)

Choosing a Sponsor

All candidates must have a sponsor. Sponsors must be 16 years of age or older. They must have received the sacraments of Holy Eucharist and Confirmation. Sponsors must be practicing Catholics and if married, the marriage must be valid. Parents may not be a sponsor for their child. Sponsors must have a Letter of Eligibility from their current parish if the sponsor is not from Our Lady of Guadalupe.
